USG Survey – USG sent Vaccination survey to institutions to distribute to faculty and staff. Shana will contact Stuart Rayfield at the USG Systems office as CSU just sent out a similar survey to faculty, staff and students but only received 200 responses. Shana and Michael Tullier will discuss next steps.

CASE Management Position – Temporary position to assist COVID-19 Response Team and assist with CSU Summer Camps.

Food Delivery Service – Waiting on background checks. This service will provide food to students in quarantine. Will also check to see if any of our current CSU drivers are interested.

Deborah Bordelon:

Enrollment – spring – Head Count – 7,689 - up by 260 as compared to last year at this time - 3.5%, 7,689.

Credit Hours – 83,514 up 1,360 as compared to last year at this time, 1.66%.

Students were dropped last Friday for non-payment and did not qualify for any type of payment plan.

Returning Students up by 72 students, up 195 in credit hours

Returning Graduate – up by 114 students, up in credit hours 746.

Sending weekly enrollment report to USG Systems office

Undergraduate Applications – 3,778 – up 1,373 applicants as compared to last year at this time.

Acceptance – 2,817, up 1,255 as compared to last year at this time.

Graduate Applications – up – 1,562

Summer Semester – May need to look at a number of online courses for students.

Sam Gurski – Continuing Education – will be our point person for our summer camps. She will work closely with Julio and Shana – campus may have a virtual component to keep density down on campus.

Housing – 78% occupancy rate – down from last year at this time.

First Year Student housing applications – currently at 88 as compared to last year at this time – 30. Continuing to work on returning student housing applications.

USG Mental Health Initiative – Gina will ask Dana Larkin to attend the next ELT meeting.

Women's Soccer opening game last Sunday vs. Young Harris at the Walden Soccer Complex. Fans in attendance did a great job in complying with COVID-19 protocols. This Friday they will travel to Tuscaloosa for an exhibition match against Alabama Men's Basketball on their rescheduled game at Lander on Monday evening. Games have been cancelled for Wednesday/Saturday of this week.

Women's basketball returns to play after a three week COVID pause on Saturday at home vs. Young Harris

CSU Track will host a track meet on Saturday at the JD Evilsizer track in Smith Station, AL.

CSU Softball will host a doubleheader on Saturday and Sunday this weekend at the Cougar Field.

Phone call last week from Dr. David Lewis (Superintendent – MCSD) - Opportunity to partner with Muscogee County School District – expand Coca Cola Space Science Center to focus on robotics. Will have Nancy set up a meeting with Dr. Lewis and representatives from CSU for further discussions.

Submission turned in on the three questions from State Representative Emory Dunahoo regarding any courses that identify privileged and oppressive:

- 1) Are any classes within the Georgia public school system or the University System of Georgia teaching students that possessing certain characteristics inherently designates them as either being “privileged” or “oppressed?”
- 2) Are any classes within the Georgia public school system or the University System of Georgia teaching students what constitutes “privilege” and “oppression?”
- 3) Are any classes within the Georgia public school system or the University System of Georgia teaching students who identify as white, male, heterosexual, or Christian are intrinsically privileged and oppressive, which is defined as “malicious or unjust” and “wrong?”
